TIME — A PRECIOUS GIFT



Two weeks ago, we flew to Austin to visit my parents. I have told some of you before that I try and go every 3 months "to change the A/C filters." Dad is a stickler for wanting them changed, and so I consider this my job, my contribution, since I can't be there as often. We laugh every time that he reminds me, as he did last Tuesday, "So, I'll see you in April." And most of the time, I go just to see mom and dad.

This last trip however had a special purpose. Mom turned 80 years old on January 12th, and Dawn, Jodi, and I felt we should do something special for her. So, we invited her friends (and some of ours) to an 80th birthday blow out. And a blowout we had. Over 100 people came and wished her a happy birthday. I met people who live in their neighborhood (who all asked, "now you're the preacher, right?"), reconnected with old family friends, and celebrated Darlene Rush, my mom. It was a special time of fellowship, fun, and fajitas. Our girls were there, hanging out with the cousins, Jodi was snapping great candid shots and meeting all kinds of people (most of whom I didn't know), my sister was an exceptional host, and amazingly, my dad stayed the whole time (he usually wants to leave after an hour). It was a beautiful day in Austin, Texas, with my whole family gathered together.

We don't get those days much anymore. Time passes and kids become adults and have their own lives and pretty soon, you begin to wonder if you'll ever have those times like before, when everyone was together. So, we try to make special moments at times like holidays or birthdays. We want to hold on to just a small part of those pieces of our lives that brought laughter and smiles.

I am beginning to realize more and more just how precious our time is with those we love. I've always known that, I mean how many times have I sat with families as they said goodbye to their loved one and listened to the stories they tell or the memories they share. They are so precious!

The writer of Ecclesiastes reminds us in chapter 3 about time and the dance we have with it:

For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven:

- a time to be born, and a time to die;
- a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted;
- a time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and a time to build up;
- a time to weep, and a time to laugh;
- a time to mourn, and a time to dance;

I know that there is nothing better for them than to be happy and enjoy themselves as long as they live;

Ecclesiastes 3:1-4, 12

The writer says much more, but you get the idea. In time, we face the ebb and flow, the good and bad, the happy and sad. And often, we can't get to one without the other. So we muddle on through life, sometimes we mightily struggle, sometimes we gleefully glide, but hopefully we are always cognizant of just how precious every moment is. Notice, I left out the expected adjective—fleeting—in front of *moment*. It was intentional. Because I don't think any moment in time should be "fleeting," lasting a short time. It should be a time we remember, a time we learn from, a time that changes us in one way or another, that challenges us. A time we cherish.

I'm not saying that every moment is filled with joy, trust me, I've had some of those. But every moment has made you who you are today, and I thank God for who you are. So, there is time ahead, maybe a long time, maybe not, but there are places to go, things to do, and people to see. What are you waiting for? It's time!
