In about two weeks, we will have wrapped up another successful Trunk or Treat event in our parking lots. Tim Ghianni will be part of a panel discussion at the prestigious Southern Festival of Books at 10:30 a.m. Sunday, Oct. 22, in the Harpeth Room of the Tennessee State Library and Archives.

Tim, author of *Pilgrims*, *Pickers and Honky-Tonk*Heroes, will be one of three authors on the panel who has written books about elements of Nashville and its music. When the panel concludes at noon, for about 30 minutes, Tim and others will sign books being sold by the festival at an author's table right outside the building, which is adjacent to Bicentennial Mall.

The Southern Festival of Books: A Celebration of the Written Word is a two-day event that is among the country's oldest literary festivals, welcoming approximately 150 authors and 25,000 visitors each October. The festival is free and includes performance stages, food trucks, and more than 60 publishers and booksellers, according to information on the fest's website: www.sofestofbooks.org.

The other two authors on Tim's panel are Paula Blackman, author of Night Train to Nashville: The Greatest Untold Story of Music City and Drew Bratcher, author of Bub: Essays from Just North of Nashville. Rob Simbeck, an acclaimed local author and journalist, will moderate.
