And I'm happy to celebrate this birthday, because for a few moments back in January, I started wondering if I was going to make it to this happy occasion. Rheumatoid Arthritis erupted in my body and I was feeling pretty low. It took doctors awhile to figure out what was wrong with me and even longer to get an appointment with a rheumatologist who could prescribe the right medication to help me. There was a lot of pain to endure. But I did, and the drugs are working now, and I'm feeling so much better. There's still a ways to go, but I'm so much better. And I know a lot of you prayed for me to get better. And believe me, I felt those prayers and I thank you.

So, I was reflecting a bit on what's happened to me recently while enjoying a beautiful afternoon this past Sun-

day at Montgomery Bell State Park. Suzanne Ghianni was with me, along with five of our Step-UP youth who had just completed their history lesson on the founding of the Cumberland Presbyterian Denomination. It's a Step-UP tradition. But they were now ready to relax and play, and the creek behind the historical cabin at the park presented a perfect playground.

Since I missed seeing so many of my church family over the past few months, it was good to be with the kids. And it made me happy to see them talking to each other, playing in the creek, throwing a football, and just being kids. Many of them have big exams this week, the kind of exams and tests that come with heavy pressure to do well. I was thankful they had these moments of carefree fellowship. On the drive home there was lots of silly chatter and giggles with Taylor Swift singing on the radio. Sometimes it got pretty loud, but I was grateful and soaked it in.





As we returned to the church, we discovered Ean and the youth group had a similar idea on how to spend a beautiful Sunday afternoon. They were all camped outside near our church baseball field, grilling hot dogs and playing games. There were lots of smiles and laughter as we pulled up to say hi. The Step-UP kids who are all now finishing up their sixth-grade school year, will be joining the youth group in a few short months. I'm always sad to see them move out of KOK, but gosh, they are going to be in good hands. And I was happy and thankful that our church provided some good old-fashioned fellowship for our younger children and youth at what can be a stressful time of year.

Church is not just about study and worship. As Pastor Kip said in his sermon on Sunday, sitting around a table sharing a meal and just talking is so beneficial to us all. Jesus did

that. And that's what I saw on Sunday afternoon with our young people. Whether it was sitting around a fire grilling or sharing snacks next to a creek, it was relaxing to be talking and being there for each other. Gosh, it was a blessing to witness.

So yeah, I'm really grateful for another birthday and for this church family of mine. Being back with the children is good for my soul....and healing. And I thank all of you for helping me get through the last few difficult months—more than you will ever know.
