#### RENOVATING THE MANSE AND RAISING THE ROOF

The Easter season is one of resurrection, renewal, and rejuvenation. While our congregation joyously celebrated Jesus's resurrection last weekend, our church now finds itself at a moment of renewal and rejuvenation. As was presented in announcements last week before worship, Brenthaven has undertaken two major developments.

First is that over the past few months, the Session has engaged a contractor to renovate the manse. The house, originally constructed in the 1960s, was recently vacated when Pastor Kip and Jodi purchased their own home last year. The Session, as previously reported to the congregation, decided to rent the house and generate an income stream to help offset church expenses. Thus, the manse has new flooring, fresh paint, renovated bathrooms, new gutters, landscaping, and other repairs all of which will command a healthy price in the rental market. We have engaged a property manager who is actively seeking a tenant to move in as soon as possible. On **April 14**, we will **host an open house right after worship** so that you can see the renovation work.

The second development harkens back to the major storm that blew the steeple off the roof two years ago, doing sporadic but significant damage to several parts of the roof. That, coupled with the fact that the roof is original to the building and is thus 18 years old, necessitates its replacement. The Session did its due diligence and ultimately has engaged a local roofing company to replace the entirety of the shingled roof. Notice, we are specifying the shingled portion because there is also a flat part of the roof that they have inspected and believe is still in good working order.

The roof work is projected to cost around \$170,000. After several smaller repairs to the church building, the insurance proceeds remaining from the storm are at approximately \$60,000. Thus, Brenthaven needs to generate the \$110,000 balance in order to fund the new roof. Representatives from the Session have begun to engage our long-time banking partner, Pinnacle Bank, about a potential loan. However, a confidential donor from this congregation has pledged to match all gifts towards the roof between now and May 1st, up to \$55,000 (or half the balance needed to fund the roof). With this generous gift, the Session believes and hopes that this congregation can raise sufficient funds to pay for the new roof without going into debt.

These developments allow the church to renew its facilities and to provide good stewardship over the many blessings that God has bestowed upon us. As your elected representatives on the Session, we thank everyone for their faithfulness and commitment to our mission of *loving and serving God and neighbor*.

#### MAH JONGG GROUP



Building and Grounds Ministry: Everything is on track to have the manse rented ASAP. Mighty Dog Roofing representatives attended the first part of the Session meeting to explain the quote options and answer questions. Motions were made and approved to –

- Hire Mighty Dog Roofing
- Pay 50% of the material cost immediately to avoid quarterly cost increase in materials of \$5,000
- Request permission from Presbytery to apply for a loan for roof completion (maximum \$130,000)
- Initiate negotiations with Pinnacle Bank in preparation for loan, if needed

Discipleship Ministry: All of the money needed for the summer youth Mission Trip was raised. Missions Ministry: Continuing to stay in contact and receiving updates from Reverend Kim Moore
