SUNDAY MORNING CONNECTIONS

The Discipleship Ministry Team is pleased to announce its plan for this Fall's Christian Education Season. The Team has worked together to develop a special experiment to be held during what is commonly known as the Sunday School hour. This September and October, we will offer adults exciting options for Sunday Morning Connections. We hope to focus on enhancing our connections with one another across age groups and outside our already-well-established groups of friends. We're inviting our high school seniors to join us, too.

We believe that this experiment will open our Sunday mornings to people who haven't chosen to join one of our regular classes yet. There is a wide variety of reasons some folks are hesitant to commit to a Sunday school class that is already established. This experiment, which will last only 7 or 8 weeks, might encourage some of them (you?) to come for a special class and to "dip their (your?) toes into the water" of Sunday morning activities here at Brenthaven. Options we're planning include a Bible Study taught by a visiting scholar, a video-based study and discussion of Adam Hamilton's "Christianity's Family Tree," and two sections of "Applied Missions"—one group cooking for Sacred Sparks Ministry and another group crafting to benefit different causes (CARA, Brenthaven's Craft Fair, etc.). Watch for details as we approach September, and please mark your calendars now to join us for Sunday Morning Connections. Combining fellowship with education and discipleship development seems like a good combo for us all!

Count the Night by Stars is a historical novel by Michelle Shocklee, and this month's selection for BookEnd Book Club, meeting July 20th at 9:30 am in the Adult Library.

Count your nights by stars, not shadows. Count your life with smiles, not tears. 1961. After a longtime resident at Nashville's historic Maxwell House Hotel suffers a debilitating stroke, Audrey Whitfield is tasked with cleaning out the reclusive woman's room. There, she discovers an elaborate scrapbook filled with memorabilia from the Tennessee Centennial Exposition. Love notes on the backs of unmailed postcards inside capture Audrey's imagination with hints of a forbidden romance . . . and troubling revelations about the disappearance of young women at the exposition. Audrey enlists the help of a handsome hotel guest as she tracks down clues and information about the mysterious "Peaches" and her regrets over one fateful day, nearly sixty-five years earlier.

1897. Outspoken and forward-thinking Priscilla Nichols isn't willing to settle for just any man. She's still holding out hope for love when she meets Luca Moretti on the eve of the Tennessee Centennial Exposition. Charmed by the Italian immigrant's boldness, Priscilla spends time exploring the wonderous sights of the expo with Luca, until a darkness overshadows the month's long event. Haunted by a terrible truth, Priscilla and Luca are sent down separate paths as the night's stars fade into dawn.

For the last seven years, before "Loads of Love," this chore occurred at various laundromats where Lisa transported them to wash and dry their clothing and eat pizza.
