CREATION CARE—SABBATH KEEPING

We have kicked off a new school year and with it a new year of Youth ROCKS! Yay! I would love to start out our year by telling all of you one of the most important pieces of our Youth ROCKS puzzle this year...the 2023-2024 Youth ROCKS Theme.



This year, our new Youth Leadership Team have all agreed on a theme together. The team's members (Josh Malloy, Megan Butler, Jackson Campbell, Sophie Summit, Sophie Silvus, and adult volunteers Allie Crawford and Suzanne Ghianni) spent all summer brainstorming and spent two weeks discussing what theme options might be best suited for our group, considering the Good News that our Youth ROCKS Members need to hear. We finally settled on *Creation Care—Sabbath Keeping!*

Creation Care and Sabbath Keeping may seem like two separate ideas that are completely disconnected. When we think of sabbath, often we imagine it as self care or even a day off, but in a world where we overuse our bodies, our friends, our resources, and the land itself, Sabbath is much bigger. Here are a few of the discussions I hope our teenagers will have regarding creation and sabbath:

Sabbath is brought up very often in the bible, usually in the context of God commanding us to remember the sabbath. So it is not just a good choice for ourselves, but something that we should do for God. We finish all of our work in six days so that on that seventh day we can be reminded that work does not define us; God defines us.

Often when we discuss sabbath, we remember the creation story in Genesis. We remember God creating all of the world and then resting in the end. I think when we talk about creation we go in one of two directions, either we focus on God's creation of plants, animals, water and earth, or we talk about God's creation of mankind. While observing Creation Care and Sabbath Keeping, we hope our youth will unite these conversations. We humans are simply a piece of the puzzle, not a completely separate entity. Deuteronomy 5:12-15 reminds us that animals are included in sabbath, and Leviticus 25:1-7 tells us even the land itself should get sabbath every seven years. If all of creation is included in sabbath, are all the pieces being allowed to rest? Are we using and abusing the animals around us and the land around us?

Finally, we will discuss what the "dominion" God gives us in Genesis might mean to us from the viewpoint of sabbath for creation. Are we called to work for the land some days so that it can rest the next? Should we spend effort knitting kitty cat beds to help them rest? If all of creation is commanded to have sabbath, should we help families get enough food for their table so they can rest one day a week?

I am so excited to experience nature, sabbath, and care for ourselves and one another this year. I hope you will join us in seeking rest and care for creation, and maybe you can join us for worship outside?! (We will give more information about that later.)

One last thing, I'd like to offer a special thank you to the Cumberland Presbyterian Young Adult Retreat for their hard work presenting this theme at a recent retreat. It stretched my thinking on sabbath and now will grow into something even bigger for our Youth ROCKS community!


