SOMEBODY ELSE PRAY

"Ask, and it will be given you, search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you." Matthew 7:7

This summer, our older daughter, Laura, gave me a devotional book written by Loretta Lynn and Kim McLean. The book entitled, *A Song and A Prayer*, contains thirty devotionals inspired by the favorite songs of Loretta Lynn. Loretta Lynn met Kim McLean, a singer-songwriter, professor, and ordained minister, at a writers night in Nashville in 2018. Loretta invited Kim to her house initially for prayer time. They bonded over music, God, songs, and songwriting. Over the course of two years, their conversations turned into songs, which later transformed into devotionals and the book, *A Song and A Prayer*.

Day 6 is titled "Somebody Else Pray," and I'd like to share that reading from Loretta Lynn with you.

"I love going to church, and I sure do love to pray. I pray all the time, because God is always here with me, so it's more like we're just talking. I learned how to pray from my mama and from going to church. I used to love old-time revival meetings where we'd sing the old hymns, hear a great sermon, and then pray. I can still hear the preacher prayin' up a storm and then shoutin', "Now, somebody else pray!!" He wanted us all to have the chance to storm Heaven with our heart's desire. If nobody spoke up, he'd call on a sister or a brother and they'd rise to their feet and stand on the promises with sincere requests. People prayed for the sick, the lost, and the lame. Now and then, even a little child would pray. There was nothin' too big or small to bring God.

Prayer is powerful. Jesus taught us to pray, so He must want us to do a lot of it. Can you imagine what the world would be like if everybody prayed? Prayer is a connection, like a hotline to Heaven. It's another way to love God and others, maybe the most powerful way. Jesus wouldn't have said,"Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven" if it were not possible, and I believe that's exactly what is happening when we pray. God's will is gettin' done on earth as it is in Heaven.

We may not know exactly what Heaven looks like, but I'm praying for a glimpse of it in my life today. Now, somebody else pray!!"
