GOD'S CALL

"When the Lord saw that he had turned aside to see, God called to him out of the bush, 'Moses, Moses!' And he said, 'Here I am.'" Exodus 3:4

The children and I have been studying about Moses at the burning bush for the past couple of weeks in our Workshop Rotation Sunday School Classes. In fact, thanks to Suzanne Ghianni we even have a burning bush full of lights, streamers, and a fan blowing on it to make the flames look more realistic. (You really need to drop by the Children's Wing and check it out.) But as we quickly learned, although Moses heard God's call, he was none too quick to sign up for the task God was asking of him. In fact, God gets a little impatient with him. So, the children and I were wondering what we would do if God called on us. How would we even know He was calling? What would you do? Would you be scared? Excited? Should you tell your parents? So many questions... In the Book of Matthew, Jesus Christ told His disciples, "Many are called, but few are chosen." It is some of those few that we will study in the months ahead: Samuel, Paul, Elijah, and Esther. There will be lessons on The Beatitudes, The Feeding of the 5,000, and The Call of the Disciples.

We will study the church calendar and learn what all the different colors represent. We will celebrate Christmas and Easter. We will study all of that in all sorts of ways, such as acting out our Bible lessons in a drama, watching a movie, and making crafts that tie into our stories. There might even be some food involved. A little science gets thrown in now and then, some computer projects are nice, and the Fun & Games Workshop is always a favorite. We invite all children in Kindergarten through 6th grade to join us Sunday mornings. I will be there along with guest teachers and our devoted Shepherds, Jennie Ford and Suzanne Ghianni.

I guess for the children and me, and maybe you too, the most important thing to remember is that God is always with us and can speak to us in many ways: through scripture, hymns, a prayer, our dreams, or that inner voice. No one we know but Moses has had God speak to them through a burning bush, but many people we know have responded to God's call, like Pastor Kip responding to God's call to ministry or our youth and adult leaders who went on a mission trip this summer. Even in Kids of the Kingdom, we responded to the needs of some animals by making them items to keep them warm and healthy. We are called on to pray for each other, provide a meal for those who are sick, or help those in need. So many calls. The important point is that we learn, like Moses, to accept God's call in the end and do what God wants us to do. And that is what the children will do when we gather on Sunday mornings. We invite you to join us sometime. Just check with me on how you can help when you get that call.


CREATIVE CRAFTS NEEDS YOUR HELP

prayer, discussion, and




the consideration of everyone involved. We will continue to monitor the situation, in coordination with our local Cumberland Presbyterian pastors, Rev. Moore, and our ministry partners. Our hope is that over the next few months, we will see enough improvement to move forward with the original plan.

In the meantime, we have decided to temporarily send Kim to **Guatemala City.** She will be staying with Rev. Socorro Delgado and serving alongside her, John Jairo, and Esperanza Correa in various capacities. We believe that this will be mutually beneficial and encouraging for everyone involved. She will leave on September 18th and return December 3rd.

We remain committed to the ministry and support of our Haitian pastors and Rev. Kim Moore. We will keep you informed of any changes to the plans as things progress. Please continue to pray for Haiti and the challenges they are facing. We know that the Lord is at work, especially in situations like this and that we are called to remain patient and hopeful.

Thank you for your understanding, partnership, and support. We are in this together.
