And, once again, my vision became blurry, and not because my glasses were dirty.

Over the last month, we have been fundraising to replace the roof on the church. Truth be told, giving money to the church for a roof is not the most glamorous reason to give. But, when water damages the inside, we have to fix the outside. When the Session learned how much, you could see the energy deflate from the room, even though they knew it had to be done. And what happened? You did! Your generosity and dedication to Brenthaven made sure that the roof would be on and paid for. The day I realized it was covered was another day that I just sat in my emotions—yes, in my emotions. I sat in my office and fought back those waterfalls, waterfalls of appreciation and amazement.

This world is so overwhelmed with negativity that I worry we have forgotten to notice the little things in life. Oh, I know, the roof isn't small, but I'm not really talking about the tangible, but rather in a more ethereal or spiritual sense. Little things like saying "Thank you" or calling you by name or praising your child or giving a compliment. These are little things to many, but for those receiving them, they can be the brightest gift they have received in that moment.

I have been hearing a lot of preachers lately focusing on what we need to get right, to do right, to say right to be in true relationship with God. And I really struggle with that. Yes, I would agree there are things we should do and shouldn't do. But I also believe that before we can do any of those things the way God intended, we have to do the other thing first—LOVE.

I just think that if we take to heart these words from 1 John, then maybe we can begin to notice the little things that mean so much more than we realize. There are good things, life-giving things that await us. And, they won't all be earthshattering! Some may be little trinkets of joy that offer enormous glimpses of love and grace. May we be aware, may we stop and notice, may we appreciate—the little things!
